How To Submit	This document must be uploaded with the notice of appointment for newly appointed peace officers or any peace officer that is a lateral or has had a break in service via the POST Electronic Data Interchange (EDI). Download this document, initial, sign where required, and upload the document to the notification of appointment. If any missing information is identified, it will be returned to the agency for correction.
Approval Process	After a notice of appointment is completed, POST will verify that all information is completed before the peace officer is added to the agency roster. If any missing information is identified, it will be returned to the agency via EDI. The peace officer will not be added to the agency roster until the form is completed and reviewed by POST.
